

## Unfiltered Harm: Time for Policy Action

## Policy Recommendations

1 Ban the Sale of Cigarette Filter

Filters offer no health benefit.

**2** Classify Cigarette Filters as Hazardous Waste

Toxic and persistent filters should be regulated.

3 Prohibit Greenwashing 'Solutions'

So-called biodegradable filters and recycling schemes are ineffective and deceiving.

4 Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) Without Industry Interference

Make tobacco companies commit full responsibility for their waste.

5 Tobacco-Free Generation (TFG) Laws

Implement TFG to ban tobacco sales to future generations.

**6** Lobbying Registries and Disclosure Rules

Require lobbyists to register, make affiliations publicly available, and create an independent monitoring system.
